Condé Nast Traveler, in late 2023, predicted the rise of this trend, recognizing the shift in traveler preferences towards destinations with milder temperatures⁴. Online search trends indicate a 300% yearly increase in searches for "cooler holidays," reflecting the growing interest in coolcations⁵.

Factors Driving the Trend

The rise of coolcations is a confluence of environmental, social, and economic factors. The most prominent driver is undoubtedly climate change. As global temperatures continue to rise, extreme weather conditions, such as heatwaves, are becoming more frequent and intense⁶. For some travelers, especially those with health conditions aggravated by heat, coolcations offer a more comfortable and healthier way to travel¹⁰. This inclusivity aspect adds another layer to the social appeal of coolcations.

Economic factors also play a significant role. Cooler destinations often present more affordable travel options, particularly during the shoulder seasons¹¹. This can be a deciding factor for budget-conscious travelers who seek value for their money while enjoying unique experiences¹². The affordability, combined with the desire for novel experiences and comfortable temperatures, makes coolcations an attractive option for a wide range of travelers.

In response to this growing trend, the travel industry itself is adapting. Airlines like Norwegian Air are adding new routes to cooler destinations to meet the changing demands of travelers¹³. This demonstrates the tangible impact of coolcations on the travel industry and its proactive response to evolving traveler preferences.

By redirecting travelers to less crowded destinations, coolcations can help distribute tourism more evenly across different regions³. This can benefit both the environment and the local communities in popular tourist areas, reducing the strain on resources and infrastructure while promoting a more sustainable and enjoyable travel experience for everyone.

Future Outlook

The coolcation trend is poised for continued growth in the coming years, fueled by ongoing climate change and the increasing desire for unique and sustainable travel experiences²². As awareness of the environmental impact of travel grows, travelers may increasingly seek out eco-friendly transportation options and choose destinations that prioritize sustainability². This includes a greater emphasis on responsible travel practices, such as minimizing waste, respecting local cultures, and supporting businesses that prioritize environmental protection²³.
